Your Role

- Include adult education in your budget and workforce development plan
- Convene a Governor's Workforce Roundtable with adult learners and business leaders

For State Legislators:

Expand Opportunity in Every District

Your Role

Your decisions on funding, policy, and oversight shape the future of adult education in your state. You have the power to make opportunity more accessible to the people you represent.

- Support increased state and federal funding for adult education programs
- Sponsor or co-sponsor a resolution recognizing AEFL Week
- Visit a local adult education site and talk with learners, teachers, and employers
- Invite adult learners to testify on workforce or education bills

Your Role

Empower Your Community

- Tour a local adult education program and meet with learners
- Celebrate local success stories on your social media platforms
